

Glynn Enrichment Grants

These grants allow Glynn scholars to pursue meaningful educational or training experiences outside the academic semester (i.e. in summer or winter break). Funding is not guaranteed, but the Glynn Program is likely to support strong applications for worthwhile projects.

Enrichment projects could include:

- intensive summer language study in a country where the target language is spoken.¹
- an academic summer program that may help you develop research skills or identify an area for future research.
- an internship with a non-profit cultural or service organization that will complement current or future research plans.
- an internship abroad or in this country where you will use a second language.

Funding will be available in amounts up to the amount of the Glynn summer research grant. Funds can be used for travel, accommodation, daily living expenses, and tuition except tuition paid to Notre Dame.

To apply for a Glynn Enrichment Experience Grant, you should submit a 1-2 page proposal that addresses the following:

1. Description and motivation
 - a. a brief overview of the experience.
 - b. your reason for desiring to participate in this experience.
2. Background
 - a. any courses or other qualifications you have acquired that have prepared you to undertake this experience.
 - b. any required supplementary skills needed for this experience (e.g. language training) and how you will acquire these skills.
3. Future plans
 - a. Will this experience help you advance in your major or degree?
 - b. Will this experience help you prepare to write your senior thesis?
 - c. Will his experience help you discern or prepare for your post-graduation plans (e.g. career, graduate and professional school, service, or otherwise)?

2. Signed waivers if you are undertaking domestic or international travel.

¹ * Students with a major or minor in Arts and Letters should apply to the Summer Language Abroad program run by the Center for the Study of Languages and Cultures. Glynn funds will be disbursed by the CSLC. Be sure to identify yourself as a Glynn Scholar in your application."

Students going abroad must register with Notre Dame International and receive approval before funds will be released to them.
